



## Girl Scout Day at the Lelooska Cultural Center

Explore the Lelooska Museum and immerse yourself in Native American Cultures

**Visit** a fur trade camp outside our museum. Learn about life in the fur trade including the use of the parflesche. View the rawhide parflesches in our collection and try your hand at painting a rawhide disk with pigment paints. Color and fold your own paper parflesche to take home.

**Discover** how to communicate simple phrases without talking using trade sign language. Learn some of the skills needed to track animals and identify their tracks.

**Experience** the museum and find art and artifacts from many different Native Peoples across North America with the Museum Hunt Activity. Explore the Native Plants of the Pacific Northwest on our grounds.

All ages of girls may attend and participate.

Each girl will receive a passport when they check in at the museum desk to fill during their visit.

At the end of their stay they will bring it back to the museum desk to receive their patch!
