Explore the Lelooska Museum and immerse yourself in Native American Cultures

Visit a fur trade camp outside our museum. Learn about life in the fur trade including the use of flint and steel for fire starting. Learn about the colorful weavings made and worn during the fur trade, then practice finger weaving your own friendship bracelet. Color and fold your own paper basket to take home.

Discover how native plants were used in a variety of ways including as decoys. Create your own miniature cattail duck decoy to take home. Explore the Native Plants of the Pacific Northwest on our grounds and how they connect to artifacts in the museum collection.

Experience the museum and find art and artifacts from many different Native Peoples across North America with the Museum Hunt Activity.

All ages of girls may attend and participate. Adults and siblings are welcome to register and participate as well.

Each girl will receive a passport when they check in at the museum desk to fill during their visit.

At the end of their stay they will bring it back to the museum desk to receive their patch!
